

Find the photograph of 230 Squadron.



Estimate how many men are in the squadron.

Find the ship transporting tanks.


How many tanks are there on the ship?

What shapes can you see in the flags? How many of each shape can you see?




Flags have lots of different uses. A flag can be for decoration. A flag can be the symbol of a country. Flags can also be used to send messages.

What do you think these flags were used for?


Go to the Beehive room

What time does it show?




Go to the Local History room

There is a table to help you on the information sheet.


Go to the Model room

What time does it show?




