Build a Hedgehog Home – Essex Wildlife Trust 2 Learning Stamps

Weave a Spider Web and then Build a Spider Forestry Commission

For this challenge we would like you to weave your own spider web. You'll need some wool/string and some twigs. All of the instructions are on the Forestry Commission website, just follow this link.

"Archaeology is the study of things that people made, used, and left behind. The goal of archaeology is to understand what people of the past were like and how they lived.

Scientists who study archaeology are called archaeologists. Some archaeological sites, such as ancient cities, are visible on the surface.

Archaeologists find clues about the past. They use a variety of extraction or digging techniques. Equipment like trowels, pickaxes, and even bulldozers help archaeologists coordinate and participate in fieldwork to attempt to unearth artifacts, such as pottery, ancient tools, seeds, or animal bones."
